

▼ WEBSITE DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

1	1. 9	Security and Backups
		Back up the entire website regularly — especially before plugin updates or migrations.
		Keep a copy of backups both on the server and local storage.
		Remove unused or outdated plugins that may pose security risks.
		Ensure SSL is installed and functioning correctly.
✓ 2. Link Management		
		Regularly check for spammy or low-quality backlinks.
		Remove or disavow harmful links that affect SEO rankings.
		Fix all broken internal and external links using a link checker.
		Simplify permalinks to descriptive URLs (e.g., /theories-of-education instead of dated links).
💼 3. Plugin and Tool Management		
		Install only essential plugins for site functionality.
		Keep plugins updated and check compatibility before updating.
		Uninstall unused plugins to minimize vulnerabilities.
		Maintain a list of installed plugins for quick reference: Anti-Spam, Better Search Replace, Broken Link Checker, WooCommerce, Complianz, Display Posts, Duplicator Pro, Fluent Forms, Humix, Math ML block, Newsletter, RankMath, Redis Object Cache, Search in Place, WPCode Lite.
4	4. \	Website Speed and Caching
		Optimize caching settings; purge only updated URLs (not the entire cache).
		Use Content Delivery Networks (CDNs) to reduce latency and speed up page loads.
		Monitor website performance with GTMetrix or similar tools.
	П	Optimize images and limit auto-loading videos or heavy scripts.

	5. /	Al and Automation Assistance	
		Use AI assistants (e.g., ChatGPT) for troubleshooting and writing support.	
		Refine AI-generated outputs manually before publication.	
		Experiment with AI-powered analytics and content tools (e.g., NichelQ, Writio).	
	6.	6. Analytics and Monitoring	
		Review Google Search Console for 404 errors and indexed pages.	
		Check analytics tools (Google Analytics or Ezoic) for slow-loading pages and high bounce rates.	
		Identify top-performing posts and underperforming pages for optimization.	
		Track direct traffic trends — an indicator of loyal readership.	
	7. I	Migration and Server Management	
		Use dedicated tools (like Duplicator Pro) for site migration.	
		Verify permalink structure post-migration to prevent 404 errors.	
		Use FileZilla for large file transfers beyond the upload limits.	
		Choose efficient control panels like CloudPanel over traditional cPanel for simplicity and lower cost.	
0	8. Optimization Discipline		
		Avoid unnecessary changes when the website is functioning well.	
		Test every optimization before applying sitewide changes.	
		Document changes and their effects on site performance.	
	9. Documentation		
		Record all major changes in a physical notebook for easy access.	
		Note what actions resulted in traffic improvements or errors.	
		Use the notes to guide future troubleshooting and maintenance.	
*	10.	. Continuous Learning	
		Keep updated with current web technologies and SEO best practices.	
		Read references and experiment with new features in moderation.	
		Document new lessons learned.
